Those present stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance

<u>Approve regular Meeting Minutes from October 6, 2025</u>. – Trustee Mullett made the motion to approve the October 6, 2025, meeting minutes as presented. Trustee Roelandts seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Correspondence. - None

Comments from the Floor on Agenda items or any other items.

Jo Ann Lesser, W398N6056 Autumn Woods Drive, spoke on behalf of the residents in the Mary Lane Sanitary district respectfully requesting that Board reconsider the newly proposed billing structure requiring residents to pay for an entire year of sanitary sewer services upfront each January which imposes undue financial burden on many residents. She also submitted on record a petition that was signed by residents requesting reconsideration of upfront sewer billing policy.

Kathy Kahl, W398N5987 Autum Woods Drive, stated the same concerns regarding the upfront sewer billing policy and the financial burden it would put on others.

Keith Granum, N53W34296 Road Q, stated he is favor of not allowing aerators on the lakes in the Village.

Tom Modl, N64W35035 Road J, would like to see information out there regarding our area about summer activities such as bike paths, walking paths, maps and the lakes on what is offered in the Village.

OLD BUSINESS:

- <u>Discussion on possible ordinance for the use of aerators</u>. A representative from the DNR spoke
 to the Board on what the Statues regulate regarding the use of aerators. After some discussion, the
 Board will be looking at other areas and their ordinances regulating the use of aerators and possibly
 creating an ordinance not allowing the use of aerators from November through April.
- 2. Consider and Act on Resolution 2025-26; A resolution for the 2026 Fee Schedule. Administrator Herrmann stated all of the fees have been agreed on, but the rental of the Community Center. He stated that Highway Superintendent Salzman recommends the increase to \$250.00 rent, which would allow the Village to break even. Trustee Roelandts made the motion to approve Resolution 2025-26; A resolution for the 2026 Fee Schedule. Trustee Scully seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
- 3. Consider and Act on Assessor Contract for the Village of Lac La Belle. Administrator Herrmann spoke about each one of the different pricing options. After a brief discussion, Trustee Scully made the motion to approve the \$82,200 per year fee, which would include an annual re-evaluation. Trustee Roelandts seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
- 4. Consider and Act on stop sign at the intersection of Sunset & Meadow View Road. After some discussion with Police Chief Wraalstad, Trustee Mullett made the motion to not put a stop sign at the intersection of Sunset & Meadow View Road. Trustee Koepke seconded to the motion. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

- 1. Consider and Act on Resolution 2025-25, A resolution commemorating Linda Bergman years of service to the Town of Oconomowoc. No action was taken.
- Consider and Act on Ordinance 2025-11; An ordinance to create section 29-14, 29-15 and 29-16
 of the Town of Oconomowoc municipal code to require a road and ditch bond for all new
 construction and/or new culverts. Trustee Koepke made the motion to approve Ordinance 2025-

- 3. Consider and Act on road signage at the intersection of Lake Drive, Westview Road and Westshore Road. After some discussion with Police Chief Wraalstad, she said they will do a study on the area for the next two weeks and bring it back at the next meeting for discussion.
- 4. Consider and Act on Class B Fermented Beverage License for The 43's Operations, LLC, d/b/a The Happy Place, N58W39877 Highway 16, James Akers, Agent from October 20, 2025, to June 30, 2026. Trustee Mullett made the motion to approve the Class B fermented beverage license for The 43's Operations, LLC, d/b/a The Happy Place, N58W39877 Highway 16, James Akers, Agent form October 20, 2025, to June 30, 2026 with the understanding that he has the proper site plan/plan of operation filed with the County, he meets with the Building Inspector and Western Lakes to give him his final occupancy. Trustee Roelandts seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
- 5. Consider and Act on adding streetlights on Wisconsin Avenue in Okauchee. Highway Superintendent Salman stated that it would cost \$195,040 for the installation and the lights and the price is good until the end of the month, and they would be installed in the spring if approved. Trustee Mullett made the motion to approve adding streetlights on Wisconsin Avenue in Okauchee with a cost of \$195,040. Trustee Roelandts seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
- 6. Consider and Act on proposal from Ayres for inspection for Monterey Dam. Administrator Herrmann stated that the proposal was approved at the last meeting for the Okauchee Dam, but now the Village is required to have the Monterey Dam inspected. The total cost for both would be \$3,650.00. Trustee Roelandts made the motion to approve the proposal from Ayres for the inspection of the dams at a cost of \$3,650.00. Trustee Koepke seconded the motion. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.
